Miscellaneous Reviews (Held over from the February Number.)

A CO.—F.33072 (12in., 4s. ).—Albany Symphony Orchestra : Madame Butterfly Fantasie (Puccini) and In a Monastery Garden.

All the orchestral and band records in this list seem to me extraordinarily successful with the exception of the Aid-a Selection and La Bohême Fantasie which betray "lapses of intonation" ; all achieve what they apparently set out to do. But everybody has probably got adequate versions of Aida, Butterfly, La I3oh6me selections, and In a Monastery Garden ; and the other records, Flying Dutchman Overture and Gems of Chopin, are, to most tastes, unsuitable to military or brass bands. But they are magnificently played, and I cannot conceal my grudging admiration for the virtuosity of the Newcastle Steel Works Band under Mr. Baile's direction. Their work has often been praised in these pages, so I may leave technical criticism to the band-pundits.
